



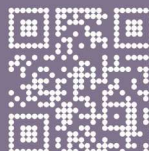

WHO are we?

The **European Joint Action on Vaccination** (EU-JAV) is part of the European Commission's priority to strengthen cooperation on vaccination policies at the European level which crystallised on 7th December 2018 by the adoption of the Council Recommendation on vaccine preventable diseases ^{*}.

EU-JAV brings together organisations and universities from **20 countries**, Ministries of Health, the **European Commission**, and a **wide range of stakeholders**, including civil society and manufacturers' representatives, working on vaccination policy and health services.

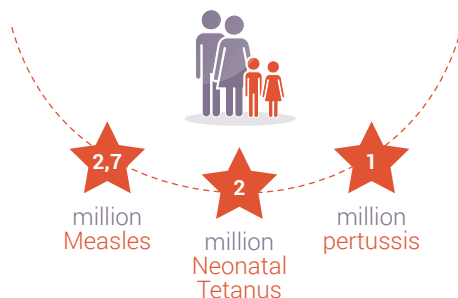
WHY do we need a European Joint Action on Vaccination?

> **15 000** measles cases across Europe in 2018 (Source *WHO Europe*)

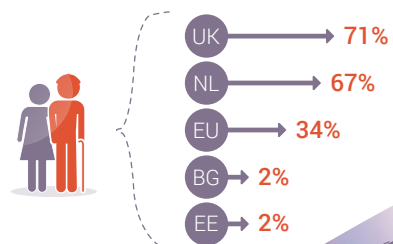


2) VACCINATION SAVES LIVES



Cases prevented worldwide every year

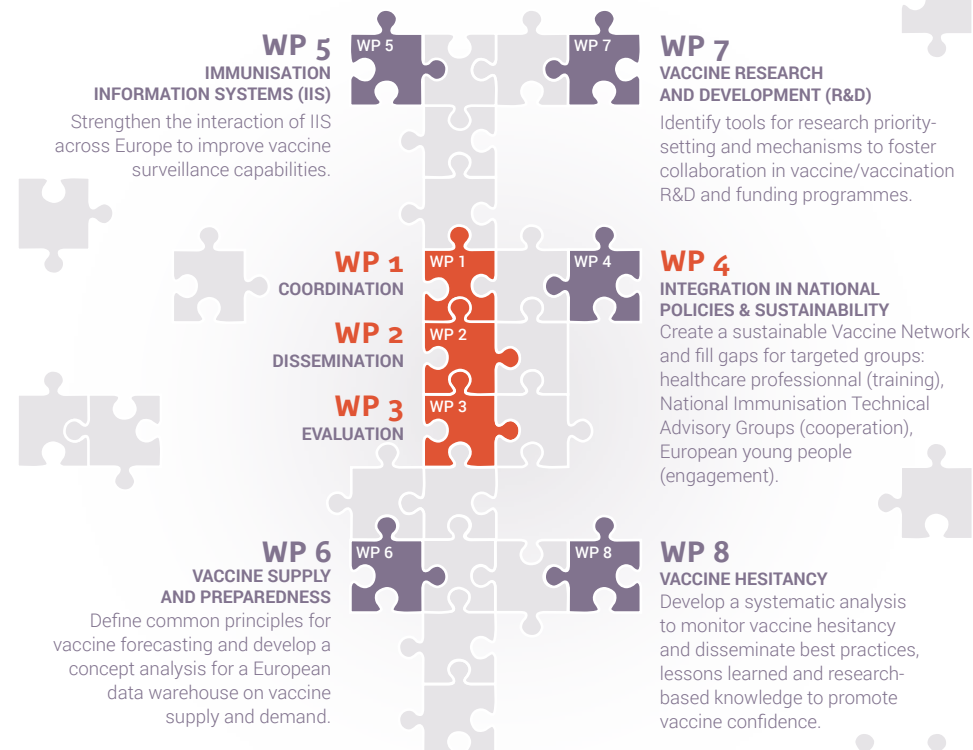
3) VACCINATION COVERAGE INFLUENZA AGE 65+
